Dear Block Party Permit Applicant:

This letter is to inform you of a program available to you through the Carol Stream Fire Protection District.

At your invitation, we will have an Engine Company and an Ambulance visit your block party. This is a great way for us to meet you and your families in a non-emergency setting. It also affords us an opportunity to deliver our message of fire safety directly to the citizens of the District in their own neighborhoods.

We do have some guidelines in order to make this program work.

1. You must have a Village Block Party permit.
2. Visits must be scheduled two weeks in advance through the Fire Prevention Bureau. You may call 630-668-4836 during regular business hours (8:00 am – 5:00 pm Monday through Friday) to schedule a visit.
3. Visits are scheduled for Saturdays and Sundays between 1:00 and 5:00 pm.
4. Visits will not be scheduled if they interfere with other District business.
5. Each visit will last approximately 30 minutes.
6. Children will not be allowed to climb on the apparatus. No rides on apparatus will be allowed.
7. Visits are made by in-service companies. This means they must respond to calls if needed. It also means that the companies may be late or not attend at all if they are committed to a previous emergency call.
8. Lights on apparatus can be operated. However, the air horns and/or siren will not be sounded. This is so we do not disturb people in the area who are not involved in the party or scare small children who are at the party.

We at the Carol Stream Fire Protection District want you to have a great, SAFE summer and remember: **TEST YOUR SMOKE DETECTORS** and **PRACTICE YOUR FAMILY FIRE ESCAPE PLAN.**

BLOCK PARTY INFORMATION

- ❑ Your Block Party Application is needed ***three weeks*** before the date of the party. **PLEASE PRINT THE ADDRESSES LEGIBLY!**
- ❑ The barricades will be delivered to the contact person on the Friday before the party. The Village will pick them up on the first work day after the party.
- ❑ If the contact person has not received the barricades by 3 p.m. the Friday before the party, please call the Public Works Department at 871-6260 and ask for Linda. The contact person is responsible for damaged or missing barricades.
- ❑ Block parties are usually permitted unless the street closing is for a personal party which excludes block residents or the block party would result in the closing of a portion of a major emergency access road such as: Thunderbird Trail, Munson Drive, Evergreen Drive, Spring Valley Drive, Merbach Drive, and Iroquois Trail, among others.
- ❑ If there is ***a vacant residence*** on the block please indicate this on the application next to the address.
- ❑ **Residents who will be on vacation the day of the block party must indicate this next to their address.**
- ❑ There are no permit fees for block parties.
- ❑ Sound Amplifier information is attached.
- ❑ Included is an information sheet from the Carol Stream Fire Protection District regarding their "Fire Safety Program" for block parties. If interested, you are required to make these arrangements.
- ❑ If you have any questions, please call the Village Manager's Office at 871-6250.

Carol Stream Park District's "Party Wagon"

The party wagon is transported to and from by one of our Parks trucks. Our staff sets up and takes down for the customer.

Space requirements - the wagon is 15' x 10', and the canopy is 10' x 10'.

ARTICLE 5: SOUND AMPLIFIERS

§ 15-5-1 PERMIT REQUIRED.

(A) With the exception of parades, it shall be unlawful to maintain or operate any loud speaker or amplifier connected with any radio, phonograph, microphone or other device by which sounds are magnified and made heard over any public street or public place without having first obtained a permit therefor.

(B) No permit shall be required for amplification devices used on private property in residential districts only. However, all restrictions contained in § 15-5-5 shall also apply to amplification devices used at block parties and on private property in residential districts.

§ 15-5-2 PERMIT FEE.

The fee for the use or operation of any radio receiving set, talking machine, amplifier, or other similar device to be operated from a fixed location or in a moving vehicle on any public place shall be \$25 for any day or part of a day for which the permittee desires to have a permit.

§ 15-5-3 APPLICATION.

Any person, firm or corporation desiring a permit for the use or operation of such a device shall file an application with the Village Manager upon a form provided therefor, setting forth the name and address of the applicant, the name and address of the owner of such device, the date upon which it is intended to be used, the purpose for its use, and such other information as may be prescribed.

§ 15-5-4 ISSUANCE OF PERMITS.

Such permit shall be issued upon the payment of the fee to the Village Manager, as provided above, and shall permit the use of such device subject to the terms and conditions of this Article, only upon the date specified on such permit and no other.

§ 15-5-5 RESTRICTIONS.

(A) No person shall use or operate or employ any noisemaking device within the village limits between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 10:00 a.m. on any day.

(B) No person shall use, operate or employ any such device within a radius of two blocks from any hospital or within the radius of two blocks from any church or other place of worship while services are being held.

(C) No person shall cause or permit to be emitted from any such device any lewd, obscene, profane or indecent language or sounds, or allow any false representation of any matter, product or product advertised whereby the sale of which is prohibited by law, ordinance or statute.
