## 6-Week Fall Leaf Sticker Use Period Continues through the Nov. 13<sup>th</sup> Collection Week

Flood Brothers offers a leaf sticker for only 70¢ to be used for fall leaf disposal during a designated 6-week collection period **continues** through **Friday, November 17<sup>th</sup>**. Residents must dispose of their leaves in a Kraft paper bag or a 32-gallon rigid container. Leaves placed in plastic bags or mixed with other yard waste will not be collected. - ◆ Wear a **brightly colored or reflective costume;**
- ◆ Choose a **costume without a mask;**
- ◆ Always **stop, listen & look both ways; before crossing** street corners;
- ◆ Always **walk and never run;**
- ◆ **Trick or treat in familiar areas;**
- ◆ **Trick or treat in the company of an adult,** family friend or guardian;
- ◆ **Instruct children not to eat any candy until a parent or guardian has inspected it;**
- ◆ **Check your local paper & TV for local candy-checking services.**
